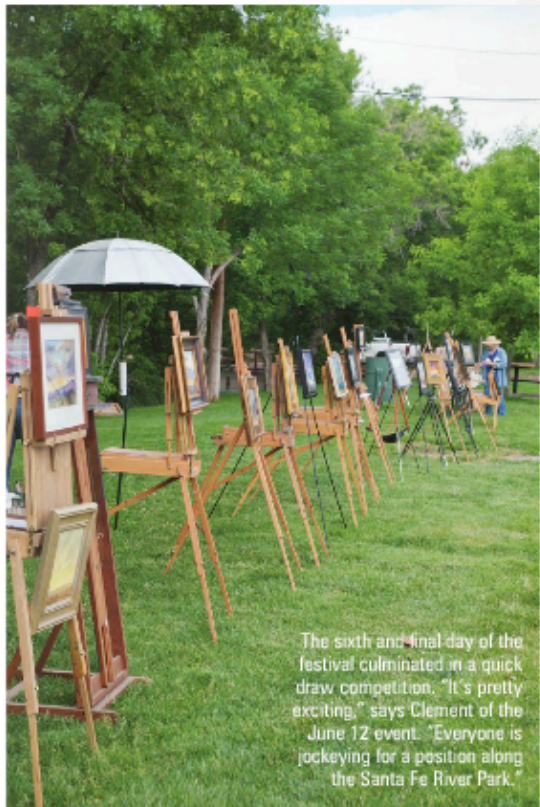


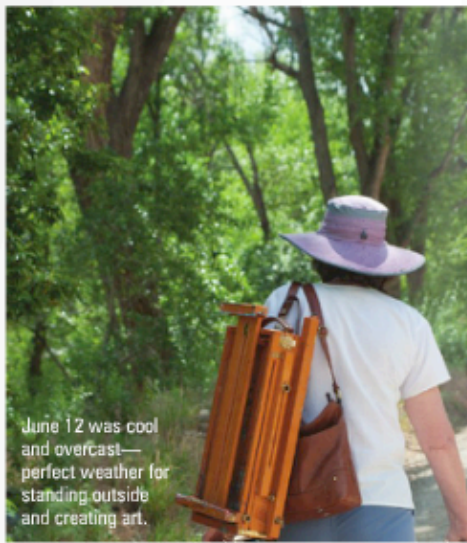
Plein Air Festival

the third annual event featured a quick draw along the Santa Fe River

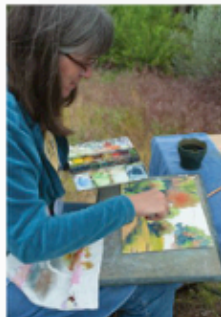
